DURESS ALARMS

A question was asked at the annual electors meeting about duress alarms. If you are having difficulty with your duress alarm since NBN was introduced in Kojonup and surrounding areas please contact NBN and they will assist you with upgrading your alarm.

There was also some concern that nurse call bells had been removed from the independent living units at Loton Close some years ago. These units are provided for community members who are “independent” not those requiring ongoing care.

If a community member requires ongoing care and assistance it may be time for them to consider if the independent living units are where they should be living or seek other duress alarm products to maintain constant contact with their family, if required.

Kojonup is lucky to have a wonderful accredited aged care facility for those requiring full time care and respite. Due to the increased care needs of the residents at Springhaven Lodge and limited staff resources we cannot provide a service to the independent living units at Loton Close or to the wider community.

We can however offer respite and permanent care if required at Springhaven Lodge. Central Great Southern Home and Community Care in Katanning can be contacted to provide in home support. Please ring me if I can be of any assistance with any of the above.

Dob in a volunteer who's doing great work in the Great Southern!

If you know a volunteer who's doing great work and deserves recognition, we want to hear from you.

The Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries (DLGSC) is searching for sport and recreation volunteers in the Great Southern who make their club a better place because of their support and service.

If you know someone like that, please nominate them for the Mike Stidwell Medal.

Nominations are now open for this annual award which recognises outstanding contributions to sports administration. The award honours the memory of former Department of Sport and Recreation regional manager Mike Stidwell and his selfless and long-term contribution to sport and recreation in the region.

DLGSC's Great Southern Regional Manager, Chris Thompson, says the award is open to all volunteers.

"It doesn't matter if you're young or old, or how long you've been volunteering with your club," says Chris.

"This award recognises that volunteers are the backbone of their clubs and communities and if you know someone like that in your club, I encourage you to nominate them so that their hard work and generosity can be publicly acknowledged."

The selection committee will consider a combination of administrative performance, length and type of service, value to the organisation, people skills and character.

To be eligible, you must live in Great Southern region or have done so within the past two years. Nominees must predominantly have been involved in a sport and recreation club or group in a volunteer administrative role.

Previous nominees may be re-nominated this year. This acknowledges the fact that valued contributions are often made over many years.

The late Mike Stidwell was Regional Manager of the former Great Southern Department of Sport and Recreation from 1979 – 2000. The first medal was awarded in 2000 and is an on-going award through his family.

Nominations close on **30 April 2019**, with the winner announced during National Volunteer Week (20 – 26 May 2019) at the Volunteer Recognition Sundowner on **Monday 20 May** at Centennial Stadium in Albany.

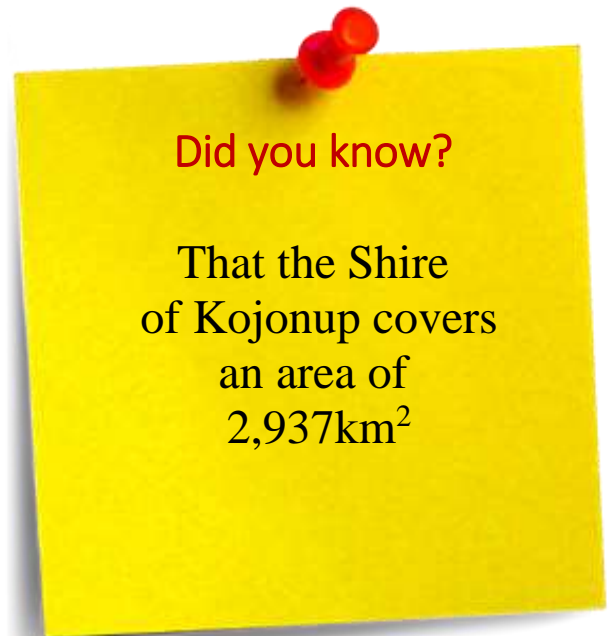

Do you know a local volunteer or group that you consider has provided invaluable contribution to our town? The Shire of Kojonup is seeking nominations for the **Annual Volunteers Awards** that will be held during National Volunteer Week on **Sunday 26th May at 2.30pm in the Kojonup Memorial Hall.**

There are **4** different award categories to consider:

- **Volunteer of the year:** This award will be given to an individual who has worked tirelessly to benefit the community. People nominated for this award must be over the age of 35.
- **Young volunteer of the year:** Locals that are nominated for this award must have made an outstanding contribution to the community and must be 35 or under. This is open to students who have taken part in volunteering either off their own back, via their school or through other programs.
- **Community Group of the year:** This award will be given to a community group comprising of more than 3 people whom gave up their time in order to make a positive influence amongst the wider community between May 2018 and April 2019.

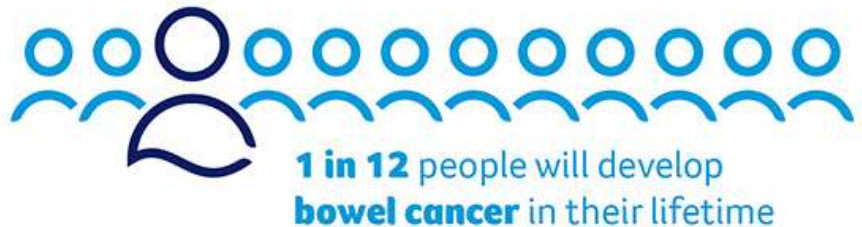


The Cancer Council WA is offering grants of up to \$200 to community groups to host a community event to promote the risk of bowel cancer in our community.

CENTENARY CELEBRATION OF KOJONUP'S HADLOW & BAILEY FAMILIES

The Kojonup community is invited to join the family members at an exhibition of Hadlow and Bailey families 100 years of settlement at Kojonup and Qualeup 1919-2019 at **3.30pm Saturday, 13 April at the RSL Hall.**

2019 marks 100 years since both the Hadlow and Bailey families settled in the Kojonup district.

Hadlow Family: Arthur Isaac Hadlow or “Pop” as he was affectionately known with his wife Florence Gertrude Hadlow (nee Bodley) settled in Kojonup.



Hadlow & Bakery Tearooms

During the period between the two World Wars Arthur Hadlow contributed greatly to the commercial development of Kojonup and the Great Southern. Born in Maidestone, Kent in England on 7th August 1873, Arthur the fourth of ten children migrated to Australia in 1889. In 1900 he was operating a bakery in Bunbury when he met and married Florence.

Arthur enlisted as a baker and served overseas for the duration of the war. After the war in 1919, Arthur decided to move to Kojonup with his wife where he bought a bakery on the corner of Albany Highway and George Street (now the site of Aura Art Gallery).

Arthur and Florence had 12 children with 7 surviving to adulthood.

Bailey Family: Francis Feddiman Bailey married Laura Gertrude Simpson, a Salvation Army Officer and with the Great War ending in 1918, it was decided a change was necessary and together with their 7 children they left their whole milk dairy in Swanbourne, Perth in 1919 to move to Kojonup's Qualeup timber farming area.

The family bought a 1200 acre property one mile directly south of Qualeup siding known as “Woodlands” and selected Conditional Purchase land south and west of the farm house lot adjacent to the Eulin Rail Siding area.



The Bailey and Hadlow families became connected through the marriages of two of the Bailey boys, Cecil and Roy to Hadlow girls, Dorothy and Muriel respectively.

The above snippet was taken from the history of the two Kojonup pioneering families. Discover and hear the full story and the contribution the families made to the development of the town at the Centenary Celebration and exhibition on the 13th April.

Smoke Alarm

Changing Your Smoke Alarm Battery

Only working smoke alarms save lives

Whether you need to change your smoke alarm battery will depend on the type of smoke alarm you have.

Is it time to change your battery?

Smoke alarms powered by 9V ALKALINE BATTERY require you to replace the battery every year. DFES recommends you change your battery on April 1st.

Smoke alarms powered by a 10 YEAR NON-REMOVABLE LITHIUM BATTERY do not require you to change the battery each year. Do not try to remove these batteries.

MAINS POWERED (HARD WIRED) SMOKE ALARMS are powered by an external power source. These alarms also have a battery back-up for periods of mains power outage. Many models have a rechargeable (non-removable) battery and do not need replacement. Refer to the manufacturer's instructions to see if you need to change the battery. Where you need to change the battery, DFES recommends you do this on April 1st.

You should know...

- Smoke alarms will make a 'beep' or 'chirping' sound when they have a low battery or are faulty.
- Mains powered smoke alarms may also make this low battery warning after periods of extended mains power outage. If this happens and your smoke alarm has a replaceable battery, you will need to change your battery.
- Not all smoke alarms need their battery replaced. Smoke alarms with a non-replaceable battery may have a warning that the battery is not replaceable. Always check the manufacturer's instructions before replacing the battery.
- Mains powered smoke alarms are required to have a green "Power ON" LED indicator. This will light up when the alarm is connected to mains power.
- All smoke Alarms also have a red light that flashes momentarily every 40-60 seconds to visually indicate they are operating. This same red light flashes continuously when the Smoke Alarm has been activated. If there are interconnected smoke alarms the fast flashing red light will indicate which smoke alarm initiated the alarm.
- Always test that your smoke alarm is operating after replacing the battery by holding down the test button until you hear a loud alert tone. All smoke alarms require regular maintenance. Refer to Fact sheet 4 – Smoke Alarm Maintenance for further information.
- All smoke alarms require replacement every 10 years.



In the event of a fire

- Crawl low under smoke.
- Assist or alert any people in danger, but only if it is safe to do so.
- Go to your safe meeting place, such as your letter box.
- Call **000** (triple zero).
- Wait for firefighters to arrive.
- Do not re-enter a burning house under any circumstances.
