Albany Highway Pavement Surfacing:

Fulton Hogan Industries are to conduct surfacing works on behalf of Main Roads WA within the Shire of Kojonup.

The existing pavement has come to the end of its serviceable life and will be removed and replaced with new pavement. This will include the profiling and removal of the existing surface, and the placement of new asphalt.

Bin it, you know it's the right thing to do!



Did you know that being a litter bug could cost you a fine of \$200?

Littering in Western Australia is an offence under the Litter Act 1979, which is WA's principle litter legislation. Littering offences are investigated by our Shire Ranger.

Want to report a litter bug? You can register online and lodge a report via <https://www.kabc.wa.gov.au/report-littering> or by contacting our Shire Ranger on 9831 2400.

As you may be aware, the WA Government is banning certain single-use plastic items in 2 stages during 2022.

The 2022 ban includes items such as: all plastic shopping bags (including thick bags); disposable plastic straws and cutlery; disposable plastic cups for cold drinks; and a range of foodware items. Please note that compostable or 'plant-based' plastics are not allowed for most of these items. Detailed information on the ban and alternatives is available here: www.plasticsbanwa.com.au

Similar to the service they provided for the lightweight plastic bag ban in 2018, the **National Retail Association (NRA)** is delivering a range of resources and assistance for businesses including a tollfree hotline (**1800 817 723**), website for businesses (www.plasticsbanwa.com.au) and a range of factsheets, posters and point-of-sale materials to help you inform your suppliers, your team and your customers.

They are also **visiting 200 shopping centres and precincts** across WA providing printed materials and personal advice to as many retailers as possible.



During this visit, an NRA representative will be walking through the centre, visiting retailers in their stores to provide you with printed materials and answer any questions you may have. The NRA are specialists in plastic bans across Australia, but are also experienced retail staff so they understand commercial pressures and will try not to interrupt you in busy times where possible.

INVITATION TO COMMENT ON DRAFT GUIDELINE - COMMENT PERIOD EXTENDED

On 17 December 2021, the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation (DWER) published the *Draft Guideline: Spring exemptions* for public consultation.

This guideline provides information for landowners or occupiers of land on the requirements for determining whether a spring rising on a property is exempt from regulation under the *Rights in Water and Irrigation Act 1914*.

In response to public feedback, we have extended the public comment period by a further two weeks. The deadline for making a submission on the draft guideline is now **5pm on Tuesday 31 May 2022**.

NATIONAL RECONCILIATION WEEK 2022

National Reconciliation Week (NRW) is a time for all Australians to learn about our shared histories, cultures, and achievements, and to explore how each of us can contribute to achieving reconciliation in Australia.

The dates for NRW are the same each year; **27 May to 3 June**.

These dates commemorate two significant milestones in the reconciliation journey— the successful [1967 referendum](#), and the [High Court Mabo decision](#) respectively.

27 May 1967 On this day, Australia’s most successful **referendum** saw more than 90 per cent of Australians vote to give the Australian Government power to make laws for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people and recognise them in the Census.

3 June 1992 On this day, the Australian High Court delivered the Mabo decision, the culmination of Eddie Koiki Mabo’s challenge to the legal fiction of ‘terra nullius’ (land belonging to no one) and leading to the legal recognition of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples as the Traditional Owners and Custodians of lands. This decision paved the way for Native Title.

Reconciliation must live in the hearts, minds and actions of all Australians as we move forward, creating a nation strengthened by respectful relationships between the wider Australian community, and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

WA Seniors Strategy Consultation

The State Government, on behalf of the Hon. Don Punch MLA, Minister for Seniors and Ageing, is keen to hear the thoughts and opinions of older Western Australians to help shape Western Australia's first Seniors Strategy.

We would like to hear from:

- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people aged 55 years and over,
- Non-Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people aged 65 years and over, and
- People approaching their senior years.

This consultation process is being facilitated by Indigenous Professional Services Management Consultants on behalf of the Department of Communities.

Community Service Organisations (CSOs)

As part of the State Government's commitment to support Community Service Organisations (CSOs) during the COVID-19 pandemic, the Department of Communities will supply your organisation with Rapid Antigen Tests (RATs) for your employees who become **asymptomatic close contacts (with no symptoms)**. The aim is to make it easier for eligible organisations to replenish essential items to help protect those who are most vulnerable in our community.

You can order RATs via the [Department of Communities - COVID PPE/C and RAT Request Form](#). Use the online form's calculator to ensure you order enough RATs for your workforce.

Eligibility

To be eligible, Western Australian CSOs must be funded by the Department of Communities and a not-for-profit charity, non-government organisation, society or other body, which provides the following services:

- supported accommodation services
- family and domestic violence services
- homelessness services
- child protection services
- critical complex outreach and in-home support services.

Please note: organisations which receive their primary funding from another government source will not be eligible to order RATs through this process.

Dam Level Nears 12 Feet

With the registration of a further 30 points of rain at Kojonup last week, the level of the Kojonup reservoir rose to 11 feet 8 inches, representing a water storage of 3,314,000 gallons. 772 points of rain have registered at Kojonup so far this year.

“DIPPING INTO THE PAST”

This week, the Kojonup Historical Society's column "Dipping Into The Past" consists of information supplied by the Lands Department.

The information concerns the early settlement of Mooradup, and comments by Kojonup residents are again invited by the Society.

Until the early 1900's, Mooradup was known as Mooradup Pool.

There was no record of any settlement of Mooradup until about 1866 when Mr Jas. Spencer took up 640 acres of land, which now constitutes the present townsite. It is presumed that Spencer obtained the land on lease from the W.A. Land Company.

Captain Van Zullecom also arrived in 1866 with a 30,000 acre lease of land along the Balgarup river.

Van Zullecom held leases on three sides of Spencer's selection and had the pool incorporated in his holding.

The Mooradup Pool area was proclaimed a reserve about 1880 and it is recorded that Van Zullecom took up 3,000 acres adjoining the reserve, on location 3976A. Records show that this land previously belonged to the

"N.B.A.", a group thought to be the National Bank of Australia.

M. E. Norrish arrived between 1885 and 1890 to take up 5,000 acres of land, previously held by Van Zullecom, and adjoining the reserve.

A further 14,000 acres of land were leased along the Balgarup river by T. Chipper, prior to 1879, and between 1890 and 1895 W. L. Jones leased 5,000 acres on the opposite side of the river from Norrish.

Two Scouts to Make 14 Mile Hike

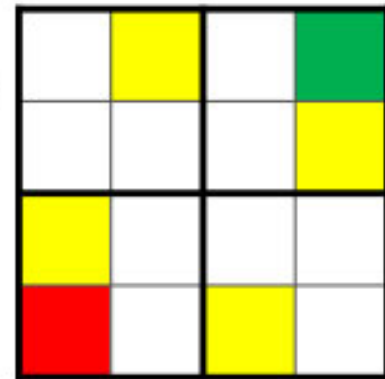
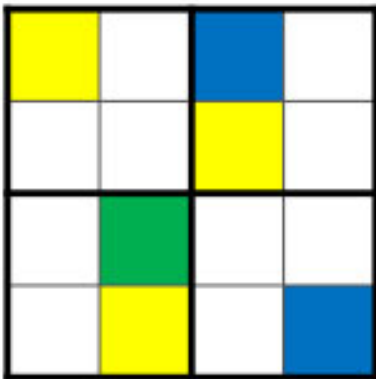
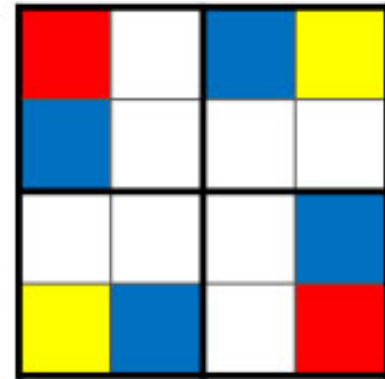
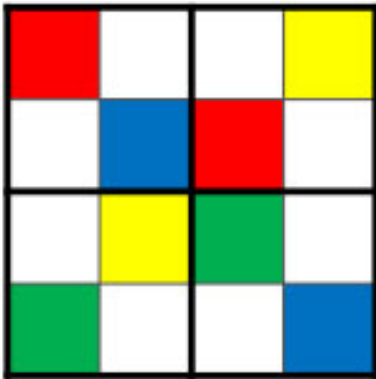
