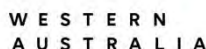

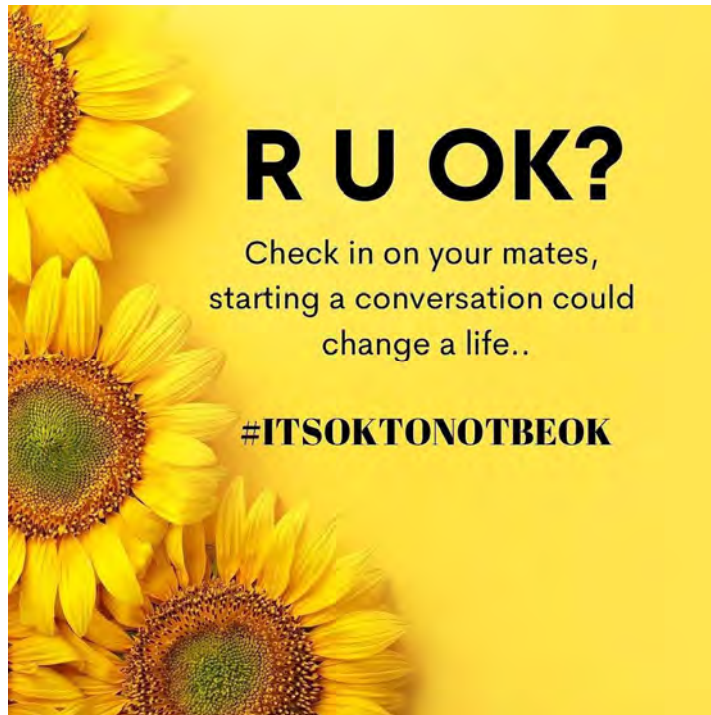

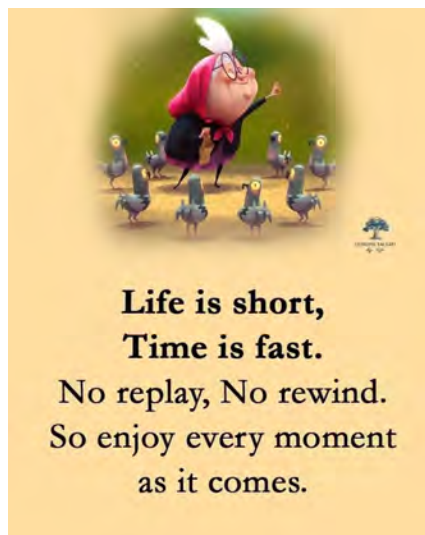
The Council also endorsed the appointment of Myles Reid as Fire Control Officer for the Kojonup Brigade.

COVID-19 isolation requirements to change

From Friday 9 September, the isolation period for COVID-19 positive cases will reduce from 7 days to 5 days – provided they have no symptoms.

National Cabinet announced on 31 August that the isolation period for COVID-19 positive cases and close contacts with symptoms will reduce from 7 days to 5 complete days – providing they are free of symptoms by the time they leave isolation. These changes will come into effect from Friday 9 September.

For people who still have symptoms after five days, they must continue to isolate.

People who work at or visit high-risk settings, such as hospitals, healthcare services, residential disability care and residential aged care facilities, and those providing care in the home, are not permitted to enter these facilities for at least 7 days following a positive test. Isolation requirements for close contacts will reduce from 7 to 5 complete days. Close contacts without symptoms may leave isolation if they:

- record a daily negative rapid antigen test (RAT);
- wear a mask at all times outside the home;
- avoid high-risk settings, including hospitals, health care services, residential disability and aged care facilities;
- notify their employer/educational facility of their close contact status
- work from home (where possible);
- avoid non-essential gatherings and contact with people at risk of severe illness from COVID-19
- notify their employer/educational facility of their close contact status.

The updated isolation requirements enable a faster return to work for people who have tested positive to COVID-19 and close contacts, while continuing to protect people in our community at greater risk of serious illness.

Harrison Place Ablution Block



You may have noticed the second phase of the Harrison Place Toilet Project is now complete. With the reticulation and lawn completed this week the facility is looking great! However, the decision has been made to keep the barricade fencing up and ablution closed until such time as the third phase of the project is complete, which is, construction of the roof. It is important that the new facility is complete and fully functional for all to enjoy so it is with regret that a finish date has not been decided due to a short supply of tradespersons and materials.

The Old Military Barracks underwent a facelift

Built as a military outpost by soldiers of the 51st British Regiment, this is Kojonup's oldest building. It was built in 1845 to replace the original wooden barracks hut and later became a school, a meeting place and then a private home, before becoming the town's museum. Today it features a Military Room with material from the theatres of war in which Australians have been involved. The last couple of weeks we had Kernowstone in Kojonup to work on the outer wall of this historical building. The walls had some tuckpointing done by replacing the current mortar with a slower eroding mortar.

KOJONUP BUSHFIRE BRIGADES

The Australian Fire Danger Rating System (AFDRS) will go live on 1 September 2022. The new system uses current science that significantly improves the ability to predict fire behaviour and reflects findings from extensive social research recommending a simplified, nationally consistent system. Please make yourself familiar with the new system to assist your families planning for the bushfire season.



The Australian Fire Danger Ratings (AFDRS) levels are:

MODERATE Plan and prepare	HIGH Be ready to act
EXTREME Take action now to protect life and property	CATASTROPHIC For your survival, leave bushfire risk areas

The AFDRS will also introduce a new Fire Behaviour Index – a scale of fire danger that takes the latest in fire science and produces outputs across eight different fire behaviour models (compared to the existing two fire behaviour models). Providing fine detail, it will support decisions about fire preparedness and bushfire suppression.

The Australian Fire Danger Rating System (AFDRS) Program is redesigning the forecasting of fire by

- Improving the scientific accuracy behind fire danger predictions.
- Improving the way that fire danger is communicated.
- Providing government and industry with better decision-making tools.
- Reducing the costs associated with bushfire impacts.

This Week's Featured Open Garden

Sunshine House - "A Labour of Love Restoration"



Wayne and Peta bought 'Sunshine House' in 2004. It was originally commissioned and built by her grandparents in 1924, but after her Grandmother Bilney's death in 1951 the magnificent garden and orchard became sadly neglected and overgrown, and Wayne and Peta began a labour of love to restore the garden to its former glory. Whilst turning back the clock they have also incorporated features of their own recognising that time moves on.

With inspiration from old photographs the restoration and development of the garden continues. Salvaging as much of the original planting as possible, from loquat and lemon trees to a selection of roses, the front garden is now an enchanting cottage garden in keeping with the age of the property.

Native plants have also been incorporated as they are not only time efficient, but attract birds into the garden for Wayne who is a keen ornithologist. The bottom of the garden hosts a small collection of Eremophilias with a recently planted grove of bamboos following a recent visit to China. The Eastern edge has been planted with 'leftovers' of donated local rose cuttings from a project at Kojonup's historic Barracks, adding to the gardens interest. Wayne has created the garden's landscaping features and stone edging.

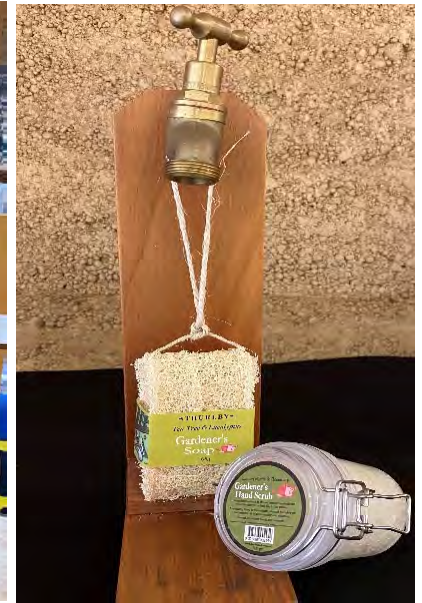

GARDENS

DID YOU KNOW?

In 2016 the Shire of Kojonup was endorsed as a Waterwise Council by the Water Corporation. We submit a Water Efficiency Action Plan which is updated annually with water savings throughout the shire. So far this year, we have reported 12 water leaks to Water Corporation or our plumber.

Some of the efficiencies we have undertaken:

- Water audits on Parks and Shire buildings and the recommendations achieved.
- All new shire buildings use minimum WELS (Water Efficiency Labelling Standard) 4 star rated plumbing fixtures.
- The swimming pool is endorsed a Waterwise.
- All Horticulture staff have completed Water Efficient Landscaping and Irrigation training.

Some ideas for you to lower water consumption at home:

Bathroom - shower with a bucket - while waiting for the water to heat up for your shower, catch the cold water in a bucket and water your garden or pot plants. You could be catching as much as 10 litres every minute. **Take shorter showers** - Almost 1/4 of household water is used in the shower. Cutting your shower time by just 2 minutes can result in a water saving of up to 30%. Try using a shower timer or play your favourite 4-minute song. **Turn the tap off when brushing your teeth** - Leaving the tap running when brushing your teeth wastes up to 10L per minute. Surveys show 8 out of 10 people have changed their habit and are now turning the tap off.

Garden/Outside - [Use a broom or blower to clean outside](#). Hosing paving is a thing of the past, it's a waste of valuable water and isn't permitted under WA's permanent water efficiency measures. It's better to use a broom or blower to clean outside your home instead.

Spring is the perfect time - prior to mulching, to add liquid or granule soil wetter products into your pot plants, garden and lawn areas. The water will absorb and soak better into the soil where the plants roots can access this. [Add waterwise mulch to protect your garden as](#) mulch reduces evaporation by keeping the moisture around plant roots. Protect your garden by applying 5-10 cm of a hard, chunky mulch and help achieve water savings of up to 20%. It is also a great way to stop the weeds!

Watering Days for Kojonup

Kojonup watering rosters are in place so only water on your allotted days.



House/Lot numbers ending in	Watering Days
0 or 3	Friday and Monday
1 and 8	Saturday and Wednesday
2 and 9	Thursday and Sunday
4	Saturday and Tuesday
5	Sunday and Wednesday
6	Thursday and Monday
7	Friday and Tuesday

Watering tips

- Sprinklers can only be used between 6pm and 9am on your watering days.
- Remember to only water once on your watering days.
- Watering in the morning is best – water soaks into the roots and is available throughout the day.
- Shorten your irrigation run times by just 2 minutes per station and see how much you can save. Did you know different types of sprinklers have different watering rates? Most irrigation systems can be reduced by 2 minutes per station and still maintain a healthy garden

Can I hand water my garden?

- Although there are restrictions in place for irrigation use, hand watering is allowed. This means you can use a watering can or hand-held hose on any day of the week. Remember to only water either before 9am or after 6pm.

Wash your car with a bucket

- You use less water washing your car with a bucket than if you use a hose or take it to a car wash.
- Using 6 buckets of water (60L) would still use less water than a typical self-service car wash. Make sure you don't leave the hose running in between filling the bucket.

Please use water wisely. Report any leaks you may see, no matter how small.



A massive thank you to each volunteer of Kodja Place for the recent total of 343 volunteer hours since early July when pruning the roses began.

Pruning (214.5 hours) was followed by cutting and laying of sleepers and spreading of mulch (128.75 hours) as recommended by Colin Barlow – Gardens of Eden - to promote the health of the roses. It was very much appreciated and delightful to have the enthusiastic year 5-6 children from St Bernard's' Primary School help. These students contributed a huge 44 hours of the 128.75 above. Who knows, perhaps a love of gardening and ongoing volunteering may have been instilled from this experience. Thanks also to Melissa Shepherd and the TAFE students who also helped out.

Maintaining the grounds of KP would not be possible without the efforts of the volunteers who freely give their time. Thank you Cathy Wright for your organisation of this special group of people. Thank you all.

Milky Way Galaxy

The Milky Way is best seen when there's no moonlight and you're away from bright city lights. What you're looking for is a band of cloudy or dusty looking light that stretches in an arc from the south east to the south

west. It looks like a cloud, but it's actually billions of stars that make up the Milky Way Galaxy, our home in the Universe.

In early evenings in June, the Milky Way has risen from the south east and stretches right across the sky to the west. By July, August and September, the core or heart of the Milky Way is high in the southern sky. By October and November, the Milky Way begins to set in the western sky.

When to look: From after sunset on moonless nights

Here are our top picks for early evening times to see the Milky Way:

- From 7pm, between 19th August – 1st September
- From 7:30pm, between 18th September – 30th September
- From 8pm, between 18th October – 28th October

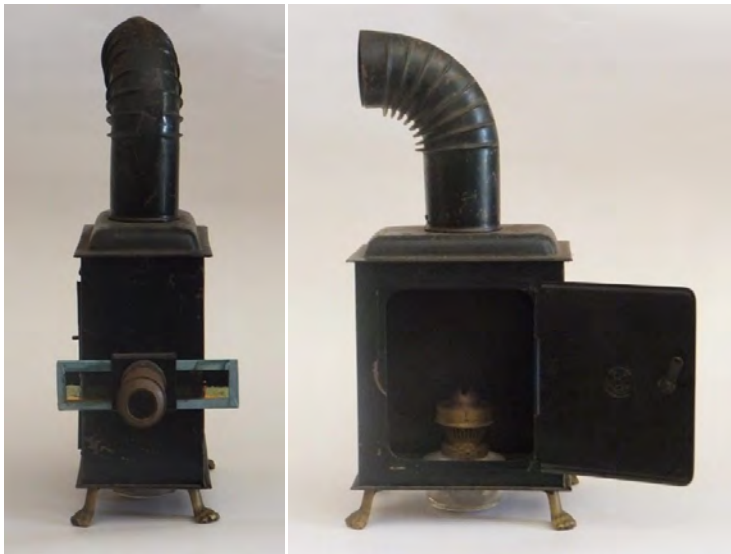

So what is a 'Magic Lantern'.

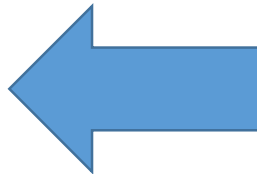

Addison is continuing to work on her film to extend it to approximately five minutes, so that it can be shown at a movie night.

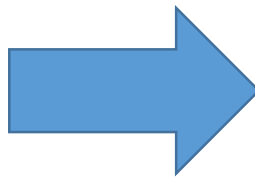

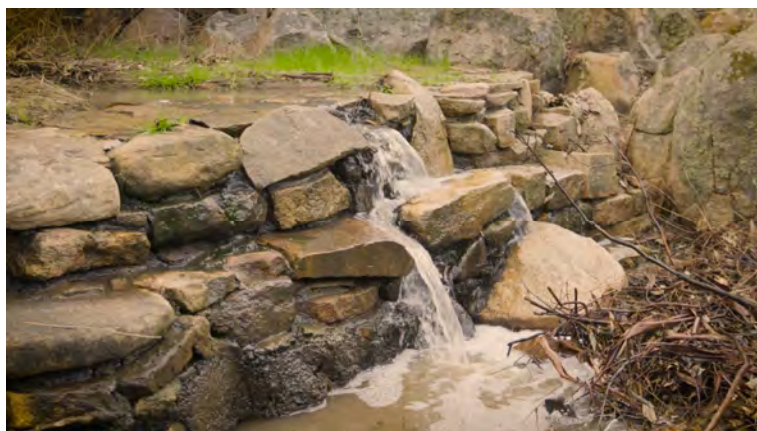

LARGER WOOL ROOM FOR KOJONUP SHOW

The extensions to the wool room, giving 40 per cent more space, at the Kojonup show-ground have now been completed and, judging by the encouraging entries, will be fully utilised.

Wool is being featured this year at the Show, which will be held on Monday, October 18, and the organisers expect keen competition for the valuable trophies and prizes.

Sheep entries promise to break all records and trade entries should compare with last year.

Exhibitors are reminded that the closing date for entries in the general sections is 5 p.m. tomorrow (Saturday). It has been emphasised that no general section entries will be received on Show Day.

Flower and vegetable section entries and late entries close at 5 p.m. on Saturday, October 16. Horse events are post entry.

Entries for the sheep shearing, always a popular event at Kojonup, must be submitted for novices by 10

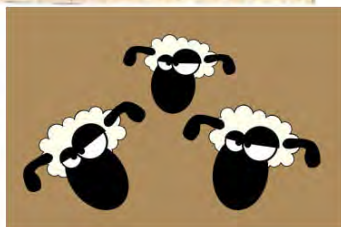
a.m. on Show Day and by 11 a.m. for the open class.

The secretary, Mr B. S. Cornell, would appreciate it if any further entries could be forwarded as soon as possible.

FREE FLIGHTS

Visitors to the Show can have free trips in a Vicia aircraft on display at a landing strip near the show-grounds.

Some of the trophies to be awarded at the Show are on display at the Kojonup Co-op.



WOOL TO BE FEATURED AT KOJONUP SHOW

Continuing last year's high standard of wool exhibits, this year's 58th annual Kojonup Show on Monday, October 18, will feature the wool section.

Special championship trophies, valued at 10 guineas each, will be awarded to the champion fine, medium, and strong wool fleeces from any class.

The shearing competition will be continued on a larger scale.

Corriedale rams and ewes (commercial in wool), over and under 1½ years, have been added to the sheep section.

In the cattle section, extra ribbons for the best Devon bull and cow (any age) have been added.

The age of the remaining cattle classes reduced to six exhibits in each, has been altered this year. Poll Short-horn, Hereford, Poll Hereford and Aberdeen Angus breeds will be confined to bulls and cows calved before March 1, 1964, on or after March 1, and on or before June 1, 1964.

For the first time a loud-speaker system will be set up, which should increase

the popularity of the ring events.

General section entries close at 5 p.m. on October 9, flower and vegetable section, and late entries at 5 p.m. on October 16.

Improvements To Kojonup Show

Entries so far for the Kojonup annual Show on Monday, October 18, are encouraging.

In addition to the usual amusement stalls, a Ferris wheel will be provided for the first time this year.

A boxing ring and racing Gokarts will be additional attractions.

The Kojonup swimming pool committee will be operating a chocolate wheel.

FLEECE BAGS

There are special bags available, at 2/- each, designed to hold fleeces for exhibition purposes, which can be obtained from the secretary, Mr B. S. Cornell.

The 15 ft. addition to the wool room is now in the course of construction and will be ready in time for the Show. With the emphasis this year on wool, the extra space is expected to be fully utilised.

As last year, the refreshment booth will be under the auspices of the Kojonup Bowling Club.

The Society is grateful to the Shire Council for providing the principal funds for converting a building into the new luncheon room, which will be ready for the 1966 Show.
