#### **BUSHFIRE ADVISORY COMMITTEE TERMS OF REFERENCE**

Established under Section 67 of the Bush Fires Act 1954.

#### **Terms of Reference**

The Bush Fire Advisory Committee is established for the purpose of:

- a) Advising the Shire regarding all matters relating to the preventing, controlling and extinguishing of bush fires;
- b) The planning of the layout of firebreaks in the district;
- c) Prosecutions for breaches of this Act;
- d) The formation of bush fire brigades and the grouping thereof under group brigade officers (in accordance with any local laws);
- e) Recommendations on Fire Control Officer positions;
- f) Feedback on the Council's Fire Break Notice;
- g) Specific requirements from each brigade with regard to:
  - Protective Personal Equipment;
  - Equipment and vehicles resources required; and
  - Training Requirements;
- h) The ensuring of cooperation and coordination of Bush Fire Brigades in their efforts and activities; and
- i) Any other matter relating to bush fire control whether of the same kind as, or a different kind from, those specified in this subsection.

#### Other:

- a) The Bush Fire Advisory Committee shall include an elected member of the Council;
- b) The committee shall elect one of their members to be chairman;
- c) The quorum required for the transaction of business at meetings of the committee is set at 50%

#### 10.4 Drought Communities Programme

The Shire is currently progressing the purchase and installation of 100,000 litre water tanks near the existing standpipes at Katanning/Kojonup Road and at Muradup.

- Construction of a new 10,000 yard water storage dam on part of the land presently leased to the Kojonup Football Club for cropping opposite the Saleyards to capture and store stormwater runoff from the Industrial Estate and surrounding catchment which in turn can be pumped to the storage dam at the Showgrounds or to Turkey Nest which irrigates the Sports Oval has occurred and pumps works and associated piping is progressing. Cr Radford reported that quotes for a solar pump and pipeline extension have been obtained for authorisation by the CEO following feedback from Works & Services.
- Constructing new retarding basins at Quin Quin Reserve and Old Drive-in area to slow stormwater during storm events as well as supplement supply for irrigation of public open space is progressing.

Members welcomed the infrastructure improvements being undertaken by Council under the Commonwealth Programme.

#### 10.5 Communications Tower

Council officers are continuing to liaise with the Department of Lands regarding the section of land contained within the Jingalup/Balgarup Road Reserve to ascertain approvals required to dedicate land specifically for the Communications Tower. This involves a comprehensive survey of the area, creation of a separate lot as distinct from the Road Reserve for the tower footprint, lodgement fees, and subdivision and development approvals. State approval based on tower design as to whether it requires guide wires or is stand alone is also essential to ensure the creation of a separate lot. This process is certainly not quick as the tower will initially accommodate DFES (WAERN) infrastructure, Bushfire Infrastructure and Council's own radio network, so the process is very methodical given it will stand in situ for 40 plus years.

Digby advised the time delay was an issue for the Bushfire Association and as President of the Association was available to assist Council in any way possible to expedite the process.

#### 10.6 Volunteer Bushfire Brigades – AGM Minutes 2021

Any items which BFAC wish to draw to Council's attention that has not been separately listed in the agenda?

 Request from Bushfire Association that Fire Control Officers be allocated green flashing lights from Emergency Services Levy which signifies their presence on the fire ground and improves OSH aspects for the volunteers.

#### 11.1 Community Emergency Services Manager Update

Mr Bransby is presently in Geraldton assisting in recovery operations from Cyclone Seroja until 3 May 2021.

#### 11.2 Town Site Firebreak Inspection Dates

As discussed at the BFAC Meeting 29 October 2020, the dates for the firebreak inspections within the gazetted town site boundaries of Kojonup and Muradup are to be recommended to Council at the Ordinary Meeting scheduled for 18 May 2021 to be moved forward by four weeks to 2 November. This will allow the Council to ensure that there is sufficient time to enforce any measures that are taken on properties that are not up the required standards as prescribed in the Fire Break notices produced each year. The dates for all land outside of the gazetted town sites are to remain unchanged.

CEO and Denise will update Fire Break Order 21/22 incorporating Brigade changes and townsite dates. CR Radford thanked Zulu's for suggesting date change.

Ross spoke of Zulu's direct approach with property owners pressing the need for improved fire mitigation compliance as not only does this protect their asset but also minimises the risk to volunteers who place their own lives at risk attending such fires.
