Public Toilets

It was very evident over the Easter/School Holiday period how popular our public toilets are to travellers necessitating additional servicing schedules. Thanks is extended to Works & Services Team Members and community members who monitored our toilets as many people judge a towns image by the quality of public toilets. Toilets at Harrison Place, Kojonup RSL and 'The Spring' have been identified for refurbishment/replacement as part of Townscape improvements including lodgement of a Lottery West funding application. Thanks is also extended to Warren Blackwood Waste for servicing our street/park bins.

Meeting with State Minister for Transport – Hon Rita Saffioti

Shire President, CEO and Council Regional Road Group and WALGA Southern Zone delegates attended a meeting at Bremer Bay on Monday 29 April to ascertain the State's regional road, rail and port strategy and long term planning, particularly within the Great Southern Zone. Access to Federal funding continues to be a major requirement given the centralised population centres predominantly along the coast and extensive freight/tourist routes/networks in WA. The same area covered by Eastern States comprises a population base in excess of 18 million people, the states of Queensland, News South Wales and Victoria plus the ACT. The Minister is fully aware of the need for WA and Local Government to receive its 'Fair Share' of sustainable funding given the economic/tourist value of our vast road network.

The Shire President also took the opportunity to seek support from WALGA and the Southern Zone to ensure that Telstra Towers (funded by tax payers via the Commonwealth) are readily accessible for emergency service and Local Government communication requirements which does not attract an exorbitant annual rental charge especially as the tower infrastructure already has the capacity and capability to include additional communication technology.

VALUE OF TOURISM

Did you know that in 2017-2018 the total tourist consumption (spend) for Australia was \$143 billon? This resulted in:

- \$57.3 billion in GDP to the economy (3.1% of the national total)
- Employment of 646,000 persons (5.2% of the Australian workforce)
- Exports of \$37.4 billion from international visitors to Australia (26%)
- \$106 billion from domestic travel (74%)

This equates to \$4,122 per international visitor and \$353 per Australian resident was spent on tourism in 2017-2018. Although these figures are great news for the Australian economy, these benefits were offset by Australian residents travelling overseas spending \$54.0 billion.

There are sharp contrasts in the value and patterns of spend between visitor categories.

- Domestic tourists spent an average of \$817 per overnight trip and \$120 per day trip, whereas overseas visitors spent \$4,122 on average during their time in Australia.
- For every dollar spent by international visitors:
 - 26 cents is spent on accommodation and food services
 - 19 cents on both transport and education
 - 15 cents on shopping and
 - 14 cents on retail food and drinks.
- Among domestic tourists, the main items of spend were:
 - transport (34 cents)
 - accommodation and eating out (30 cents)
 - shopping (12 cents)
 - food and drinks (11 cents).




