COUNCIL BRIEFS

Outcomes from Council Meeting held 11 June 2019

National Australia Medal Presentation made to Robert Sexton and Digby Stretch by Shire President, Cr Ronnie Fleay.

Natural Resource Management Advisory Committee

- 1. Receive the Natural Resource Management Committee minutes for the meeting held 6 December 2018; and
- 2. Adopt the Natural Resource Management Committee meeting dates for 2019

Request to vary development approval plan for motel units and provide universal accessible accommodation unit.

- 1) Approve the request and alter the approved new site plan to show Unit 1 as a standard motel unit on No. 70 (Lot 12) Albany Highway, Kojonup.
- 2) Grant development approval for the new universal access motel unit on No. 72 (Lot 13) Albany Highway/Spring Street, Kojonup subject to the following conditions/advice:
 - **a)** The lots being amalgamated to the satisfaction of the Chief Executive Officer (confirmation of the Landgate dealing number or similar) prior to the Building Permit being issued for the new unit.
 - **b)** The development to be generally consistent with the attached stamped approved plan and where marked in red, unless a variation has been approved in writing by the Chief Executive Officer.
 - c) A maximum of 1 universal access accommodation unit is permitted.
 - **d)** The building to be repainted in a pastel colour/tone and include a verandah to match the existing units on Lot 12.
 - e) The provision of 1 on-site parking bay suitable for the patron's vehicles to the satisfaction of the Chief Executive Officer. No parking of patron's vehicles is permitted on the road verge or adjoining land.
 - **f)** Any new access/egress crossover point onto Spring Street to be sited, designed and constructed to the satisfaction of the Shire of Kojonup and/or onto Albany Highway in consultation with Main Roads WA.
 - **g)** The accommodation unit to be connected to the Water Corporation deep sewer and water supply networks.
 - h) All stormwater to be retained and/or disposed of or reused on-site.
 - i) The site to be landscaped including shade trees and vegetation between the buildings and boundaries in accordance with a Landscaping Plan to be submitted for approval by the Chief Executive Officer.

j)



- k) The provision of a 1.8m high screen fence along the side boundaries at the proponent's cost.
- I) The proponent to prepare a bushfire management plan and/or evacuation plan to achieve compliance with the WA Planning Commission's State Planning Policy 3.7 'Planning in Bushfire Prone Areas' to the satisfaction of the Chief Executive Officer in consultation with the Department of Fire and Emergency Services.
- **m)** The applicant making arrangements to the satisfaction of the Environmental Health Officer for a rubbish storage area (i.e. bin enclosure) and collection service."

Advice Notes:

- *a)* The placement of the unit and construction of the verandah addition requires a separate Building Permit to be obtained prior to any works commencing.
- *b)* A Demolition Permit may also be required to be obtained prior to any sheds or structures being removed from Lot 13 to facilitate the development.
- *c)* The applicant is encouraged to liaise with their Registered Building Surveyor Contractor to ensure that the proposed position of the new unit and access to common areas can achieve the minimum requirements of the National Construction Code.
- *d*) It is important that the accommodation unit and patrons are properly managed to ensure there is no disruption or adverse impacts on the surrounding properties.

National On-Farm Emergency Water Infrastructure Rebate Scheme

The Australian and Western Australian governments are working together to deliver \$4.6 million in national rebates to livestock farmers and pastoralists in rural Western Australia for on-farm water infrastructure. The National On-Farm Emergency Water Infrastructure Rebate Scheme is available to eligible commercial livestock farmers and pastoralists in rural WA.

Eligible activities

Listed below are eligible activities under the National On-Farm Emergency Water Infrastructure Rebate Scheme.

- Pipes.
- Water storage devices such as tanks and troughs associated with stock watering.
- Water pumps and associated water distribution systems.
- De-silting works of existing dams by a contractor.
- Drilling of new stock water bores and bore pump tests to confirm yield and water quality suitable for stock. Pump test results to be submitted with invoices. Note: To receive a rebate for a new bore, it is a requirement to check licensing requirements with your regional Department of Water and Environmental Regulation office before commencing any drilling for groundwater. More information: www.dwer.wa.gov.au/water or 1800 508 885
- Power sources to distribute water to livestock watering points (including generators, windmills and solar).
- Other materials, equipment or fittings necessary to install water distribution infrastructure excluding purchases of machinery.
- Any freight costs to purchase and install the equipment.
- The professional installation costs to install the water infrastructure.

About the rebate

The rebate is for 25% up to a maximum of \$25 000 for the purchase of new water infrastructure, delivery and installation to address animal welfare needs and improves resilience to drought.

Eligible items include water storage devices such as tanks and troughs, pipes, fittings and pumps associated with water distribution systems, new bores and the desilting of dams by a contractor.

Rebates can be applied to costs incurred after 30 June 2018, and applications close 30 April 2021 or when the funding allocation is exhausted, whichever occurs first.

Find out what you can claim

Eligible items include water storage devices such as tanks and troughs, pipes, fittings and pumps associated with water distribution systems, the drilling of new stock water bores and the desilting of dams by a contractor.

What you will need

To apply you will need to have the following information and documents:

- 1. Property details and location
- 2. Lease agreement (if applicable)
- 3. Scanned copies of all paid itemised invoices of water infrastructure, delivery or labour
- 4. Scanned photos of completed works

Back to the Tap! Reduce, Reuse, Recycle with Keep Australia Beautiful (WA) Community Litter Grants and the Shire of Kojonup

With assistance from the Keep Australia (WA) Community Litter Grants, the Shire of Kojonup has been able to install a Meet PAT water bottle refill station at the much-frequented Apex Park in Kojonup. The water that comes out of the Meet PAT is fully filtered.



Bottled Water – Did you know?

- It takes up to 3-7 litres of water and one litre of oil to produce one litre of bottled water.
- A recent Sydney Morning Herald article showed Many taste tests have shown most consumers can't taste the difference between bottled and tap water.
- Bottles used to package water take over 1,000 years to bio-degrade and if incinerated, they produce toxic fumes.
- Most water bottles end in landfill.
- The average Australian drinks 30 litres of bottled water per year.
- Australians buy more than 118,000 tonnes of plastic drink bottles a year.
- It takes 8 years to recoup the cost of a bottle of water by refilling the bottle with tap water.






Invaders taking toll on threatened species

According to new research from the Threatened Species Recovery Hub, Australia's 10 worst invaders based on how many threatened species they impact are out... some of the top 10 may surprise you.

- 1. European rabbits impact 321 threatened species
- 2. Phytophthora plant disease impact 236 threatened species
- 3. Feral pigs impact 149 threatened species
- 4. Feral cats impact 123 threatened species
- 5. Feral goats impact 116 threatened species
- 6. European red foxes impact 95 threatened species
- 7. Lantana impact 95 threatened species
- 8. Blackberries impact 47 threatened species
- 9. Black rats impact 42 threatened species
- 10. Feral cattle impact 39 threatened species

The survey asks questions about the incidence of and problems pest animals and weeds cause, the cost of management and the types and effectiveness of control actions-both on-farm and conducted by local groups.
